GUINEA PIG GREATNESS

Do's and Don'ts

Guinea Pigs are incredibly social creatures and enjoy being handled and interacting with their owners. However, they can get into skirmishes with each other. To avoid an accidental litter and to deter from altercations, it is recommended that they are separated by sex when housed together (male-male housemates.) Each individual pig should have their own 'hide box' within the habitat, and prepare to provide a separate enclosure for those irreconcilable differences!

Due to their propensity for obesity and gastrointestinal issues, a proper diet will help to decrease future concerns. Clover and alfalfa should not be offered as they can predispose your pig to bladder stones. Iceberg lettuce and cucumbers should also be withheld as they can cause GI upset such as diarrhea. Other common issues that effect guinea pig health include respiratory and eye infections, lumps, dental and GI problems, and feet sores. Daily inspection for any of these concerns can minimize complications with early intervention.

Unlimited access to Timothy hay promotes proper tooth wear and GI health with its high fiber content. In addition to Timothy hay, commercial pellets and a small amount of green, leafy vegetables such as kale, parsley, spinach, broccoli, green and red peppers each day will keep your guinea pig at their best!
